1. Important Words — A to C

Aberration — deviation from normal

Example: His behavior was an aberration

Abhor — to hate strongly

Example: She abhors violence

Acrimony — bitterness/ill feeling

Example: The dispute ended with acrimony

Admonish — to warn/advise

Example: The teacher admonished the student

Alacrity — cheerful eagerness

Example: He agreed with alacrity

Ambiguous — having double meaning

Example: His answer was ambiguous

Ameliorate — to improve

Example: Steps were taken to ameliorate the situation

Amiable — friendly, pleasant

Example: She has an amiable personality

Appease — to satisfy/calm

Example: He tried to appease the angry mob

Arduous — very difficult

Example: Climbing the mountain was an arduous task

Benevolent — kind, generous

Example: The benevolent king helped the poor

Candid — honest, frank

Example: Give me a candid opinion

Capitulate — to surrender

Example: The enemy capitulated after the siege

2. Important Words — D to G

Debacle — a sudden disaster

Example: The project ended in a debacle

Diligent — hard-working

Example: She is a diligent student

Eccentric — unusual, odd behavior

Example: He is known for his eccentric habits

Eloquent — fluent, persuasive speech

Example: She is an eloquent speaker

Emulate — to imitate/copy

Example: Students should emulate good leaders

Enervate — to weaken

Example: The long illness enervated him

Euphemism — mild word for harsh thing

Example: "Passed away" is a euphemism for died

Exacerbate — to make worse

Example: Rain exacerbated the flood situation

Fallacy — wrong belief

Example: It is a fallacy that hard work always leads to success

Frugal — careful with money

Example: He leads a frugal lifestyle

Gregarious — sociable, outgoing

Example: She is gregarious and loves parties
